Could's Jewish man who died in obscurity in Melbourne be the unsung creator of the Volkswagen? Port Phillip council thinks so - in the next few months it will honour him in a plaque at Edgewater Towers, the St Kilda apartment block where automotive engineer Josef Ganz once Eved.

In Germany in the early 1980s, Gunz was an influential editor of car magazine Motor-Kritik and a cerultunt angineer for Daimler-Beaz and BMW.

In the race to build an affordable "people's car" or "volkswagen", he nade prototypes similar to the fu-

ture Volkswagen Beetle. They were light weight with backbooe type frames, mid or rear-mounted engines, independent wheel suspensions and swinging rear halfaxles. A 1981 Ganz model was called the Maikafer, or May bug.

In 1953 Garer presented his Standard Superice model, with a curved shape, to an intrigued Adolf Hitler at a Berlin motor show.

In his 2012 biography of Ganz, Dutch journalist Paul Schilperoord says that later in 1983 Game was arrested by the Gestape on trumped-up charges of intimidet

Schilperoced says Ganz was only released through a friend connec-

ted to senior Nazia. Gamz fled to Switzerland, and later France, but his career stalled, and he emigrated to Australia in 1953.

Schilperoord claims Hitler and advisers such as Ferdinand Porsche used Gaza's ideas for the Volkswagen, which went on to global fame. Schilpercord says Ganz is a genius akin to Henry Ford, who the Nazis tried to erase from history.

In Melbourne, Ganz worked for General Motors Holden and fought to gain compensation for his Euro-

Gamz was a friend of Hermo Benshemesh, wife of Edgewater Towers' architect Mordechai Benshemesh. The couple gave Ganz a fat in the building after it opened in 1961. Gang died from heart fallure there in 1967.

The council's heritage plaque to be placed on the Marine Parade frontage will note that the 13-storey Edgewater Towers which has stunning views of St. Kilda and Melbourne CBD, was Melbourne's first privately developed high-rise apartment block

It says notable residents include "Josef Ganz, the Jewish automotive engineer who was the originator of the Volkswagen" and politiclan and cyclist Sir Hubert "Oppy"

Next Saturday, as part of Open

House McRourne, volunteer resid ents will lead free tours of the building including the roof view and its groovy 1960s-style lobby with an exhibition of ads, newspaper articles and photos of post res

The building's unofficial archiv ist, Russell Jessop, hopes the tours give recognition to a landmark oulding whose past residents have included prostitutes, politicians, musicians and pro-abortion campaigner Dr Bertrem Walner.


Mr Jessop said Ganz represented "so many people whose stories were airbrushed and just forgotten. If you don't capture them now, they'll be knet."




Edgewater Towers



Edgewater Towers is an high rise apartment block located in Melbourne, Australia. The building, completed in 1961, was Melbourne's first, privately developed high rise apartment block^[1] and the tallest in Victoria until Robin Boyd's Domain Park Flats was completed in 1962. The building was designed by émigré architect Mordechai Benshemesh who designed many multi-storey buildings in St Kilda and Elwood.^[2] Edgewater Towers is considered to be Benshemesh's most iconic design.^[3]




East Terrace: Paving, seating/lounging, BBQs, canopy & benches.

West Terrace: As East Terrace without BBQs or benches.

The Hurdle

For Construction Permit the Building Surveyor (BS) required proof the existing concrete slab is adequate for load.

BS insisted even though there has been rooftop access as evidenced by the perimeter balustrade and dual fire exits.

No As-Built Records at State Library or St Kilda Town Hall.

Three scanning technologies were trialled without success (Zero cost). Thank you to flats that accommodated access.

The final solution was **Structural Load Test** 5-7 Sept. 2017. Thank you to flat 12H that accommodated access.





Sinking Fund
